Dear Chairman Carr:

I write in support of the Federal Communications Commission's ongoing effort to modernize the television ratings system to ensure parents have more clear, accurate, and transparent information about the content their children are consuming.

Parents, not television executives or Hollywood producers, should have the final say in deciding when and how their children are introduced to sensitive topics related to gender identity and sexuality. Parents across Louisiana and the country increasingly feel that the liberal media and entertainment industry are quietly inserting ideological content into children's programming without transparency or parental consent. American families should not have to worry about their children being indoctrinated by the radical left through the shows they watch.

As the mother of two young children, I share these concerns and believe this issue deserves serious attention. The television ratings system was created to empower parents with the tools needed to make informed decisions for their households. If programming includes themes related to transgenderism or gender identity, parents should have the ability to easily identify and review that content before it reaches their children.

Thank you for your leadership on this important issue and for your commitment to protecting parents' rights and strengthening transparency for American families.
